

Phalaenopsis species

- Phal. bellina \$35.00
We believe our line of Phal. bellinas to be the finest offered anywhere. They are built on a background of 'Ponkan' AM/AOS and Dr. Henry Wallbrunn's breeding with 'Merrilee' and 'Bravo' which both received AM/AOS awards back in the late 1970's. Also, the winner of the Herb Hager Award for 2005 Phal. bellina 'WOW' 4.7 NS and 5.5 NSV came from our line of breeding. The intense violet picotee is what set it apart. The AOS description said of it 'Awarded for sensational color and markings on a beautifully formed flower.'
- Phal. corningiana \$35.00
6.0 NS Creamy white flowers that are heavily overlaid with blood red color. We have three crosses to offer – take your pick.
Phal. corningiana 'Fernbrook' AM/AOS x 'Red Rebel'
Phal. corningiana 'Carol' HCC/AOS x 'Fernbrook' AM/AOS
Phal. corningiana 'Angela Marie' x self
- Phal. equestris 'Pimlico' var. alba \$25.00
Has beautiful pure white flowers with a bit of yellow on the callus/side lobes. Unusually flat for this species. Very prone to grow keikis.
- Phal. equestris 'Riverbend' AM/AOS \$35.00
Has an 87 point AM and is reported to be a 4N. Quantity limited.
- Phal. fasciata \$25.00
Offering keikis from one of our old plants that has been in our collection so long that we cannot remember whom it came from. Truly a collector's item.
- Phal. lueddemanniana 'Crestwood' \$25.00
Phal. lueddemanniana 'Red Robin'
Phal. lueddemanniana 'Woodlawn'
Phal. lueddemanniana 'York' or 'Arlington'
Since we have five clones to offer the choice is yours or you can buy all five for \$100.
If you are interested in where the red pigment comes from in Phal. H.P. Norton, Phal. lueddemanniana contributes 26.95 % while Phal. violacea is second with 14.45% and gigantea is third with 10.94%. Phal. luedde has had a mighty influence on all red breeding.
- Phal. mannii 4N 'Henry Wallbrunn' var. alba \$200.00
Just before the passing of Dr. Henry Wallbrunn we were fortunate enough to obtain this plant which he had colchicine treated. These are stems that were made in our laboratory at Orchidview. Flowers

have 5.0 N.S. with golden yellow sepals and petals overlaid with chartreuse.

- Phal. mannii (Black MAJ' AM/AOS x MAJ's Ebony' AM/AOS) \$35.00
Offering a sib cross of what may be the finest Phal. mannii plants in cultivation. Flowers are butter yellow and heavily overlaid with dark chocolate brown. Not as 'bow-legged' as most Phal. mannii.
- Phal. pallens 'Tejas' AM/AOS \$50.00
There have been only three AOS awards given to clones of this Species and 'Tejas' received the only AM awarded. Flowers are Yellow/green with lavender spots and bars. When awarded it had 19 flowers on five inflorescences, some branched. 5.2 NS
A must have for collectors.
- Phal. philippinense 'Orchidview' HCC/AOS x 'Katherine' \$25.00
8.5 N.S. Flowers are 'crisp white with light purple suffusion on reverse'. Natural spread is among the largest shown on Wildcatt summery. Beautiful mottled leaves.
- Phal. venosa \$35.00
Our Phal. venosa line originates from 'Red Mahogany' AM/AOS and 'Red Chestnut'. which both came in one of the very first shipments to the US. In the early days of Orchidview our beautiful Phal. Lippeglut 'Pink Princess' was awarded 85 point AM/AOS. We traded a stem of this plant for a keiki of 'Red Mahogany' AM/AOS and our venosa breeding program began. All our crosses since then have been 75% 'Red Mahogany' AM/AOS and we have never had a bad cross.
